

Betting In Billiard Hall

After evidence for the prosecution had been given, Mr. C. J. Philcox entered a plea of guilty on behalf of Norman Edward Willis, journalist, of Kent Town, when he was charged in the Adelaide Police Court yesterday in company with William Sams, unemployed, of Adelaide, and Harold Gordon Dickens, laborer, of Lower North Adelaide, with having been at the Hutt street billiard saloon on May 13 for the purpose of unlawful betting. Mr. Dayman appeared for the prosecution.

Mr. Philcox's contention that there was no case for Dickens to answer was upheld by Messrs. F. W. Harrop and J. Fowler, who dismissed the charge against him.

The question of penalty in the case of Willis was held over until next Tuesday, and the charge against Sams was adjourned until the same day.
